For your class project, I'd like you to take a basic HTML site and class it up using the CSS we've talked about over the last two days. If you already have a website you are building (like your homework project from TCS7D), you can use that. Otherwise, you can download `example_html_site` from the course website. Your CSS should adhere to the follow rules:

- 1- Use an external style sheets for all global styles. If you have page specific styles, put them in a `<style>` element. Do not use inline styles.
- 2- Include at least one element selector, one class selector, one ID selector, and one descendent selector.
- 3- Center the content of your page using `width` and `margin` attributes.
- 4- Select an appropriate font stack. If you choose to use web fonts, please include them in your submission.
- 5- Include at least one div with a background image set using `background-image`.

Projects fulfilling the above requirements will get a passing grade. Bullets listed below are OPTIONAL and for extra credit only

- 6- **Give your site a horizontal navigation bar with links to the different pages.**
- 7- **Insert a media query so your site displays differently depending on browser width.**
- 8- **Write your style sheets using LESS instead of CSS. Submit your LESS files along with the CSS files and HTML files.**
- 9- **Build your site using a combination of custom CSS files and Bootstrap.**
